what a difference! We have no God to carry; which you have to hang on the wall, or put on a table. Who, when you speak to Him, does not answer and who cannot hear! We have a God who has eyes and sees us and before whose face we can walk. Who listens to us when we pray. And one day, hopefully soon, His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives. We will come back to this world with our God here. Praise the Lord!

Ethiopia:

I would like to tell you again something about what we have experienced with our God. It's nothing

spectacular, but still, and I find this remarkable: God has preserved us again on this journey. How many kilometers did we fly and drive and nothing bad happened. What a miracle. We have been told that it would be dangerous to be outside Addis Ababa. We were about 200 km from Addis, but it was all good. For me, the visit to a prison in Zuway was the best experience. There we were able to meet with about 100 prisoners. We were allowed to preach, hold a small diploma ceremony and pray with the prisoners. After the sermon, I was allowed to invite the prisoners to come forward if they wanted to convert. Although no crowds came forward, at least two prison-

ers came forward and accepted the Lord Jesus as their Savior. For that alone, it made sense to do the whole trip: joy in heaven!!

Zuway is also the place where we wanted to hold our conference. But unfortunately, that was not possible because of the weather: it had rained too much the days before. That's why everything had remained too wet. Although the construction of the conference center has made good progress, it was unfortunately not yet ready for occupancy under these circumstances. Therefore, the brothers had rented another conference center in Addis Ababa at short notice. There we were together with about 60 people. Unfortunately, there were far fewer employees than in previous years. The reason for this

is simply that it is too dangerous for employees to travel. Unfortunately, it is very unsafe in the country at the moment. That's such a shame! Whereas in the past you could move freely everywhere, this is by no means the case now.

We also had meetings with the board of the Emmaus work, with Zecharias and Aiden Erdolo from the

1 Euroschule, with Carmen Koscheny, who introduced us to the work of "New Creation" and simply a nice fellowship with various employees.

What was new was that Petra Schäfer and Verena John were able to offer Bible study for women and children in various places, which was very well received. Uwe Schäfer was able to present the Emmaus' work and make and maintain contacts. He also provided a Riso printer for the work. In addition to being able to print Bible courses ourselves, we hope to be able to generate money for the work with this machine by supplying printed mate-

rials to other organizations. My brother Gerard and I have had the privilege of preaching in several places.

We traveled back gratefully.

Sudan

We are glad that enough money could be collected to make a trip of Pastor Ayman and Isaaq to South Sudan possible. It was her wish to visit this country again this year. Initially, it looked as if this was not

possible due to a lack of money. But lo and behold, the windows of heaven were opened, and it was possible after all.

They were in different places in the country: Juba, Aweil and Wau. There are large open doors all over the country. There were three major diploma awards with a total of over 250 students.

Muhammad confided to me this week that it is difficult to work for the Lord in this country. He has to be careful and make sure that the whole thing is not too noticeable.

Dear brothers and sisters, in Egypt and also in Sudan, the doors are wide open. When I spoke to Ayman this morning, he said, "We absolutely need large amounts of printed courses. We have requests from so many cities and areas. Please help us".

I know that with the Emmaus app we can also reach many people. Then you don't need printed courses anymore. But there are no internet connections everywhere and not everyone in these countries has a suitable mobile phone for it. So, if one or the other would like to help us a little, he or she is cordially invited.
