Dear newsletter readers,

The verse mentioned above is so impressive: Our Lord Jesus only did what He saw the Father do. He didn't do anything too much. He did nothing, too little. He did nothing wrong. His life was perfect. And then I look at myself Dear brothers and sisters, let us strive to become more and more like our Lord Jesus and to live for His glory and to do what He shows us.

Because a lot has happened again, I'm sending you a short update about what has been done and what we are planning.

Ethiopia

We are grateful that we were allowed to make our trip to Ethiopia from 08 and 13.10 - 22.10. Uwe and Petra Schäfer and my brother Gerard flew a few days earlier than me. I arrived a little later. That was a good thing: Anita had been operated on. We are grateful that Uwe and Petra were able to take part in the trip. Both had health problems, but God helped us all through!

All together we had a very nice time there again. For me it was the 36th time that I was in Ethiopia. And there is always something beautiful to experience.

A visit to **Hosanna** was interesting, about 5 hours to travel south of Addis Ababa. It's always a very nice journey. God's creation is so beautiful! There we had a seminar with 60 church leaders who are interested in the Emmaus courses. We were able to do a Bible study with them and inform them about the Emmaus work. The hunger for God's word is so great there. In this district in Ethiopia there are over 1,000 congregations and more than 1 million believers.

It was interesting to hear the **testimony** of a former prisoner who was himself imprisoned in Zuway prison for 5 years, had become a Christian through the Emmaus work and now came to the diploma ceremony at the distance of 740 km Today he works as an

evangelist in the Guji area with our courses.

Afterwards we were in **Zuway.** First, in <u>prison</u>. There I was allowed to preach in the women's prison and my brother Gerard in the men's prison. It is so much joy to meet these people there, to give them a small gift (e.g. soap or other practical things) and then to pass on the gospel. The joy and gratitude are always so great. Here, too, there was also a diploma ceremony: 12 prisoners and one supervisor received a certificate.

In the same city, Zuway, there was the annual <u>Emmaus Conference</u> with about 50 employees. We have a total of over 200 employees in Ethiopia. But because of the politic al situation in the country, many could not come. My topic for this conference was "Lessons from Psalm 119". It is a theme that shows the beauty of the Word of God and is very practical. This was very well received by the audience.

The highlight of the trip was the <u>opening</u> of our new <u>conference center</u>. In 2018, I was asked to

What do you speak about when you visit a women's prison?

I was allowed to tell these mostly young women about an elderly woman in a prison in Nairobi (Kenya) whom I had met there. At that time, she gave testimony of how hopeless she was when she was imprisoned. But after she did our courses, she found faith and found peace. At the day I met her she was so glad that she was in prison and could help other women and bring them into contact with the Lord Jesus. I was able to tell them the gospel and point to the Lord Jesus, who can give them hope even in prison.

The day after we drove early in the morning to Adama, where we had a meeting with teachers and staff of the <u>1 Euroschule</u> (Berhan School). They had travelled from Monopole. We had invited her to Adama for a seminar on the topic of "The Normal Christian Co-Worker". 60 of them had come. The theme was applied to her work at school. However, one wonders how what they hear will change the lives of these people. We are happy that many em-

ployees and children are doing the Emmaus Bi-

ble courses. Now we have over 1,100 children in our school. Praise the Lord for it. We are grateful for all our employees, both in Germany and in Ethiopia.

Unfortunately, I heard that the work - both in Germany and in Ethiopia - is not going optimally. We have approx. **550 sponsored children**. Informing them correctly takes a lot of work and time. Sometimes you get the impression that people in Ethiopia don't understand it so much. This also makes it difficult for the employees in Germany to process the letters, etc.

Other countries

Yes, there is still a lot to report about our other countries! This time I will limit myself to a few brief pieces of information, namely from Sudan, Algeria and Mauritania.

Sudan

We are very happy that we were able to open our small printing house in Juba. 24,000 courses were printed, 500 copies of Series 1 and 2 in English and Arabic. Before the end of the year we hope to have a diploma ceremony with at least 500 students. Pastor Ayman is in the process of acquiring a plot of land where he can build a conference center, etc., as in Zuway, Ethiopia.
